Notes:

- I. You may get married in the church you regularly attend, or in a church of the parish where you live. If either of you live in a different parish, the Banns of Marriage need to be read in that parish too; you'll then need to obtain a Banns Certificate to say that they have been read there.
- 2. If either of you will not be 18 by the proposed date of the wedding, the minister will need to know that the consent of parents / guardians has been obtained.
- 3. No-one is allowed by law to marry if they are still married or still in a civil partnership.
- 4. Your parish church is the church of the parish where you live.
- 5. If your father is retired, write his occupation and add the word 'Retired'
- 6. As you prepare for your special, important and exciting day, please remember that we are concerned for your <u>marriage</u> as much as for your <u>wedding</u> that's why we invite you to find out more about the Christian faith, not as some sort of insurance policy against difficulties in marriage but as a resource for investing in a **better** marriage.
 - (Please be assured that the quality of our service to you is not dependent on you wanting to know more about the Christian faith.)
- 7. It is <u>your</u> responsibility to <u>ensure</u> the Banns are read in the appropriate churches and at the appropriate times (not more than 3 months before the wedding). When the Banns are due to be read, arrive in good time and check with the church minister that no-one's forgotten!
- 8. This is a legal document. The legality of your marriage depends on what you have told us. It is an offence to knowingly tell us wrong information.

A person has a Qualifying Connection with a parish if:

that person:

- was baptised in the parish. (This does not apply where the baptism formed part of a combined service of baptism or confirmation); or
- had his or her confirmation entered in a church register book of a church or chapel in the parish; or
- has at any time had his or her usual place of residence in the parish for at least 6 months; or
- has at any time habitually attended public worship in the parish for at least 6 months; or a Parent of that person has at any time during that person's lifetime:
- had his or her usual place of residence in the parish for at least 6 months; or
- habitually attended public worship in the parish for at least 6 months; or a Parent or Grandparent of that person was married in the parish.

In all cases involving church services - i.e. coming to/going to/attending normal church services, baptism, confirmation or marriage - this applies only to Church of England services
